

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Altamonte Christian School accepts the McKay Scholarship (www.floridaschoolchoice.org), and the CTC Scholarship (www.stepupforstudents.org). For information on either of these scholarships, please go to the respective websites to see if you qualify and how to apply.

In addition to the above state-funded scholarships, ALTAMONTE CHRISTIAN SCHOOL has established a tuition aid program for families who find it difficult to pay the regular tuition. Information on this assistance is listed below.

Financial Aid

Our hope is that no family would fail to consider Altamonte Christian School for financial reasons alone. Financial assistance at Altamonte Christian School is available to qualifying families who lack the necessary resources to access Christian education for their children.

How to Apply for Aid

Each family that seeks financial aid is required to fill out an Assessment/Budget Form, available in the school office. The Program Administrator is CCC Educational Services, Inc./Christian Credit Counselors, Inc. (CCC). CCC is an independent, Christian-based organization that provides Altamonte Christian School with impartial and confidential evaluations of each family's need. CCC is located at 8475 S. Eastern Avenue, Suite 102, Las Vegas, NV 89123.

Aid Guidelines

Families will be awarded financial aid based on the results of their CCC Assessment report. Each recipient must be approved through the school admissions policies and have completed the required entrance testing prior to applying for aid. All financial aid granted is contingent upon the student maintaining acceptable academic progress, avoiding disciplinary problems, and upon parent cooperation with the school. Additional restrictions or adjustments may be added at any time throughout the year, as deemed necessary. Any family seeking assistance must reapply for financial aid each school year. Assistance will be given as funding is available. As with any Limited General Scholarship Fund / Financial Aid Program, allotments will be made on a "first come – first served basis".

(Note: students who receive the McKay Scholarship or the CTC Scholarship are not eligible to receive additional funding.)

Who should apply?

As a general rule, if a family's total income is under \$42,000 and their tuition is over \$3,000, they will probably qualify for some financial aid. If a family's income exceeds \$42,000, then their tuition should be at least 10% of their income to qualify for financial aid. For example, an income of \$50,000 would require a tuition expense of \$5,000 or more to qualify for aid, unless there are special out of the ordinary needs or circumstances.
